Pick out a perfect specimen; then select others as similar as possible-choose same maturity.

Protect from dirt, disease, infection and damage- choose specimens with no blemishes.

Check requirements carefully-enter the number or amount required to avoid disqualification.

Not responsible for entries after 10 PM on Saturday. Unclaimed, useable items will be donated.
